




Rolls-Royce Tool Roll.


A recent trip to London






On a recent winter trip to London, I noticed quite a number of Rolls-




Rolls-Royce Armoured Cars.



2BD, The Busby Ghost was one of the last Silver Ghosts to be made, before the company switched production to make armoured cars and aero engines for the First World War effort.

Towards the end of 1914, the first Rolls-Royce armoured cars were created. The cars were all conversions of civilian Silver Ghost Rolls-Royce road cars. The armoured superstructure designed by the Admiralty Air Department consisted of 10mm armoured steel plate all around, plus a single revolving turret to house a Vickers 0.303mm machine gun. The vehicles proved to be invaluable in desert situations for example when fighting in Egypt against the Ottoman forces.




Armoured Car continued.



It was a great accolade for Rolls-Royce that their chassis and engine, designed for civilian road use, were able to cope with an armoured body weighing just under five tons when loaded with four passengers and a full tank of fuel. To accommodate the extra weight only relatively small modifications were needed such as a quadruple wheeled rear axle and heavy road springs. (See above).



The very first production Rolls-Royce armoured car is chassis number 101WO, which was the number designated by Rolls-Royce for the War Office commissioned vehicles. (I guess WO stood for War Office).



Exhaust cuts out valves.



Following on from an article that appeared in our last Newsletter, about the exhaust cut-out on Roger Hall's Phantom II. Dave Berry. sent me the following article that was taken from the 1933 Autocar Road Test for the P11 Continental and gives more information on the workings of the exhaust cut-out.



Dave also sent me some pictures of the exhaust cut-out on this 3 1/2 litre Bentley. Up to this point, I did not know that any Bentley were fitted with this valve.

A. F. Sidgreaves the then managing director of Rolls-Royce was very pro the Derby Bentley being noisier than the 20/25. He wanted more noise from the air intake and a cut-out.

(11). Exhaust System.

The new type as instructed for the 15 chassis, but using the spring connections for the rear pipe instead of rubbers.

New cutout of the Silver Ghost type with the outlet inclined approximately 45° to the horizontal facing towards the rear is included.

The lengthened tail pipe should be fitted as a part of this system.

Dear Mr. Cowen,

I would like to say how much I appreciate your action yesterday in giving me an opportunity of a run on the new BENTLEY car.

This was extremely interesting and it would be very difficult to make any adverse comments on the performance of the chassis on the road.

1st September 1933.

With all due deference I would like to make the following remarks:-

BRAKES.
Although extremely efficient they do not "look" large enough.

EXHAUST CUT-OUT.

When open this gives a very 'tinny' note and should be much deeper. (This appeals to a lot of clients who buy this type of car.)

The Silver Ghost and Bentley 3 1/2 litre cut

-outs are to the same basic design, with an oblong flap valve in a suitably shaped cast iron housing. This is bolted to the side of the intermediate exhaust pipe in front of the main silencer.
